



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




VISION

JAAGO Foundation envisions a society free from all forms of exploitation and discrimination where every child has the opportunity to be educated and youth have the opportunity to realize their potential.

MISSION

To bring about substantial improvement in the lives of underprivileged children and youth living in poverty, illiteracy, and social inequality through quality education and youth empowerment.



OUR HISTORY

JAAGO Foundation's journey began humbly in a small room with just 17 students, gathered on a carpet, armed with nothing more than a whiteboard and a marker. What started as a modest initiative to provide education has now grown into a nationwide movement, with over 30,000 students receiving both formal and non-formal education across Bangladesh.

Recognizing the immense potential of the country's youth, JAAGO Foundation launched its youth wing, Volunteer for Bangladesh, in 2011. This initiative aims to harness the power of youth, volunteerism, channeling the energy and goodwill of young people to create lasting social change and raise awareness on key issues impacting the socio-economic growth of the country. Today, Volunteer for Bangladesh is a nationwide platform, operating in all 64 districts of the country, with 55,000 registered volunteers contributing to various community-driven projects, leaving no one behind.

From a single classroom in Dhaka to a nationwide movement, JAAGO's journey has been about transforming lives with education, empowerment, skill-building, and innovative initiatives. By expanding access to quality education, launching Volunteer for Bangladesh, and addressing critical issues like climate resilience, women's rights, democracy, and governance, JAAGO continues to create sustainable change across Bangladesh. Here are some key milestones in our journey of building a brighter and more equitable future for all.



2007

JAAGO commenced its journey with a single classroom in Dhaka, dedicated to providing free-of-cost education to children from marginalised communities, breaking the cycle of poverty through education and empowerment.



2009

Started providing formal education following the NCTB curriculum through JAAGO Foundation Schools to promote and uphold children's right to education.



2011

JAAGO revolutionized access to education with its Digital School Program, harnessing ICT to bridge the gap and deliver quality learning to remote and underserved communities.



2011

Establishment of Volunteer for Bangladesh, a dynamic platform that mobilizes thousands of youth across Bangladesh to drive meaningful community service initiatives, inspire a culture of active citizenship and social responsibility, and foster sustainable change.





2015

Volunteer for Bangladesh expanded its operations to 32 districts, empowering youth to drive positive change through community service.



2019

One of JAAGO's first batches of students earned a fully funded scholarship at United World College (UWC), showcasing the transformative power of education.



2020

Introduction of Tel-Ed in response to the COVID-19 crisis, ensuring uninterrupted education for children from marginalized backgrounds during unprecedented challenges.



2021

A Step Towards Sustainable Impact: JAAGO launched initiatives focused on climate adaptation and digital literacy, addressing critical global and local challenges, reflecting JAAGO's commitment to sustainable, multi-dimensional impact.



2022

Volunteer for Bangladesh reached all 64 districts of the country, uniting youth from every corner to build a stronger, more inclusive Bangladesh.



2023-2024

Expansion of youth development initiatives, focusing on employment opportunities, leadership skills, democracy and governance, and supporting climate-resilient livelihoods in vulnerable communities, paving the way for a sustainable future.





When I look back at how JAAGO began, it always feels a bit surreal. There was no grand strategy, no elaborate roadmap—just a simple, honest belief that every child, no matter where they come from, deserves the chance to learn, to dream, to have hope. That's all we had—just hope and belief. But sometimes, that's all you need.

Year after year, I've seen this belief blossom, not into something rigid or institutional, but into something alive, evolving, and real. JAAGO isn't just classrooms and programs; it's the courage of a child who raises her hand in class for the very first time. It's young people from every corner of Bangladesh standing up, not because someone told them to, but because they truly believe they can shape their communities.

This past year, especially, I found myself reflecting deeply. I realised that our mission had quietly expanded beyond just opening doors to education. It had become something more holistic, more profound. Now, it's about equipping communities, not just to survive but to thrive. Sustainability stopped being just a word to us; it became a promise, our pledge to the generations yet to come.

Certain moments still stay vivid with me. Like seeing a parent watch their child walk across a graduation stage, the very first graduate in the

family. Or witnessing a young visionary take the lead to drive the community toward resilience against climate change. Those are the moments I carry. Those are moments that tell me, yes, we're on the right path.

But none of these moments, none of these stories, belong to me alone. They belong to all of us, to our child sponsors who nurture dreams; to our volunteers whose passion amazes me every day; to our donors and partners whose generosity goes beyond expectation; and to my incredible team whose dedication continually inspires me. You are not just part of this story; you are its heart and soul.

As you turn the pages of this report, I hope you feel proud—because every milestone we've achieved is a tribute to you. The future we dream about isn't distant; it's unfolding right now, through every child we empower, every community we uplift, every act of compassion we share.

Let's keep shaping this story together, because the future isn't something we wait for. It's something we build, one belief, one child, one step at a time.



DIGITAL SCHOOL PROGRAM (DSP)



JAAGO Foundation provides free, quality education to underserved children across Bangladesh through its flagship Digital School Program. Operating 11 schools in regions such as Dinajpur, Rangpur, Gaibandha, Habiganj, Dhaka, Bandarban, Teknaf, Chattogram, Madaripur, and Rajshahi, the program currently serves 5,000 students.

Using a blended learning model powered by video conferencing, the program connects qualified teachers with students in hard-to-reach communities, enabling live, interactive classroom sessions that broaden students'

horizons. It follows the English version of the National Curriculum (NCTB) and aims to equip students with skills and knowledge to empower them to break the cycle of poverty.

In addition to education, JAAGO also ensures students receive essential materials, nutrition, hygiene products, and opportunities for co-curricular activities to support their overall development. Through this program, JAAGO is not just educating students but also empowering them to become active, productive members of society.





MILESTONES

Report Card Distribution

Across all JAAGO schools, approximately 5,000 students are assessed on a quarterly, half-yearly, and annual basis. Each report card day served as an opportunity for teachers to engage in one-on-one meetings with parents, providing report cards and discussing students' academic performance, development, and areas needing

improvement. These personal interactions fostered valuable feedback loops and helped strengthen the collaborative relationship between schools and families, reinforcing a shared commitment to continuous improvement and student achievement.



Classroom Marketing Day

At JAAGO Foundation School, students' achievements are celebrated through an engaging classroom activity called Classroom Marketing Day. To inspire and motivate young learners, teachers implement a star point system where students earn points based on their classroom performance. These points can be redeemed for gifts during the marketing day,

adding a fun and meaningful reward element to their efforts. During the event, students eagerly use their star points to purchase charming arts and crafts materials and essential classroom supplies. This initiative not only encourages active class participation and personal growth but also cultivates logical decision-making skills among students.




Parent-Student Bonding Day

A joyful event, the Parent-Student Bonding Day brings together students and their parents for a series of engaging and creative activities. The young learners participate in drawing and crafting sessions, perform rhymes for their parents, and explore sensory play by making colourful dough from flour. Together, parents and children shape vibrant alphabets with the dough, turning the classroom into a space filled with laughter, learning, and connection.

This initiative strengthens the partnership between school and home, based on the

belief that children thrive best when their learning is supported both at school and within the family. Parents enthusiastically embrace the opportunity to relive childhood moments, engaging in playful, hands-on experiences alongside their children. The day concludes with shared smiles and deeper bonds, reinforcing the school's commitment to keeping parents actively involved in their child's developmental journey.



HPV Vaccine Campaign for Adolescent Girls Students

As part of a government collaboration, JAAGO facilitated the HPV vaccination campaign for adolescent female students in its Dhaka and Madaripur schools. This initiative aimed to



protect young girls from human papillomavirus (HPV) and its associated risks, promoting better health and preventative care among students.



Freelancing Course on Graphic Design

A two-month freelancing course in graphic design was conducted at JAAGO Foundation Banani School, aiming to equip students with practical skills for the digital job market. In addition to regular classes, students stayed after school for extra training. Successful

students who completed at least one outsourcing job were eligible for a laptop loan, with repayments contributing to future CLAS projects. This initiative aimed to enhance employability and support students' career growth.



Food Safety Awareness Session

A Food Safety Awareness Session was organised by JAAGO Foundation Rayer Bazar School, during the National Education Week. Students from grades 6 to 8 participated in interactive learning sessions covering topics

like food processing, handling, and hygiene. Through engaging activities, they gained essential knowledge and skills for maintaining food safety in various settings.



Bakeman's 3rd International Language League

The Department of English and Modern Languages (DEML) at North South University (NSU) hosted the country's largest language competition, the "Bakeman's 3rd International Language League," co-powered by AECC Global. This year, students from JAAGO Foundation's Rayer Bazar, Banani, Chattogram, and Rajshahi



to national development and aligning with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



Rebuilding Bangladesh's Green Future

Bangladesh has long been known for its centuries-old trees and vast mangrove forests, which have played a crucial role in protecting the nation's biodiversity. However, with only 11.2% of the country's land covered by forests, as reported by the Asian Development Bank, the need for large-scale reforestation has never been more urgent.

To combat this Volunteer for Bangladesh-Jessore District took a significant step toward environmental restoration by planting 200 trees on the central road islands through their GREEN Hunt initiative, reinforcing the importance of environmental stewardship and collective action for a sustainable future.



Emergency Response Amidst Devastation

In the wake of devastating floods that submerged 90% of Bandarban, Volunteer for Bangladesh (VBD) displayed extraordinary dedication and resilience. Spreading the Warmth of Kindness

Tamanna's story of hope, resilience and determination

Born into a struggling family, Tamanna's father worked as a driver and her mother as a house help. For a family barely making ends meet, education seemed out of reach. However, Tamanna's dream to learn never wavered, and her life took a turn when she joined the free-of-cost education program of JAAGO.

At JAAGO Foundation Banani School, Tamanna quickly stood out for her academic dedication and curiosity. She excelled in her studies and actively participated in extracurricular activities, showcasing her eagerness to grow. Despite facing challenges, Tamanna remained focused on her goals. Her journey reached new heights when she participated in the VEX Robotics competition in the U.S. and

represented Bangladesh at the OIC High School Model Summit in Turkey, where she displayed leadership and a global outlook.

In 2023, Tamanna achieved a perfect GPA of 5 in the SSC exams, marking a significant milestone. Her family's pride grew even more when she was awarded a fully funded scholarship to attend the United World College in Armenia. This scholarship, facilitated by the UWC National Committee of Bangladesh, provides Tamanna with the opportunity to continue her education and pursue her dreams on an international stage. Tamanna's story is a powerful reminder that with determination, dreams can be realized, no matter the obstacles.



Lelin's journey from struggles to leadership

One of the first 17 students at JAAGO Foundation, Lelin began his educational journey in 2007. With his father unable to work due to illness, his brother-in-law took on the family's financial responsibility, and for a family with such struggles, education was not a priority. However, through JAAGO's free education program, Lelin and his three older siblings found hope and enrolled at JAAGO Foundation School.

In 2016, Lelin passed the SSC exam with an A+ in Science and was admitted to Scholars College Dhanmondi with support from JAAGO. His journey of success continued when he participated in the Community College Initiative

in Virginia, USA, studying Business Management in a fully funded four-year program by the United States Congress.

Lelin later enrolled at the Bangladesh University of Professionals (BUP), one of the top institutions in Bangladesh. His determination and grit led to his selection for the Youth Leadership Summit 2024 organized by the US Embassy in Colombo, Sri Lanka, where he engaged with young leaders from around the world and strengthened his leadership skills.

Lelin's story is a powerful testament to resilience, growth, and leadership.



Sohel's journey from adversity to achievement

At just 3 years old, Sohel lost his father. His father was a farmer by profession and the sole breadwinner of the family. After losing him, Sohel also lost the protective shelter over his head. His mother, unable to support him, sent him to live with a distant uncle in Dhaka. At an age when he should have been growing up with love and care, Sohel found himself completely alone.

Sohel says, "When I used to stand by the window in the morning, I would see children dressed in school uniforms going to school, and I wished I could go too. Then I requested my uncle to enroll me in a school. His daughter then inquired around and learned about JAAGO Foundation School, which provides free of cost education to underprivileged children. My uncle admitted

me there. I still remember my first day at school. From that very moment, my life changed."

Sohel thrived at JAAGO Foundation School, excelling in academics, sports, and extracurricular activities. After passing his SSC exams with top results, he continued his studies at Mohammadpur Preparatory College, and later, at the University of Asia Pacific in Computer Science and Engineering. Thanks to his hard work, Sohel earned multiple scholarships and waivers, graduating with an impressive CGPA of 3.82. He was also awarded the Vice-Chancellor's Award and the Dean's Award three times each.

Today, Sohel aspires to become a software engineer, using technology to drive societal change. His story is a powerful reminder of how access to education can transform lives.



Shurma's path to success through education and community support

Shurma, one of the first batch students of JAAGO, grew up in a family where her father worked as a van driver and her mother was a housewife. Despite their financial struggles, Shurma never let their limited income deter her from pursuing her dreams.

Her determination was fueled by the free-of-cost education program at JAAGO, which provided her with quality education and relieved the financial burdens of tuition, books, and uniforms. This support allowed Shurma to focus entirely on her studies.

Shurma excelled in her Secondary School Certificate (SSC) exams in 2020, and after

enrolling at Mohammadpur Preparatory School and College, she achieved a perfect GPA of 5 in her Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) exams.

Shurma's determination and hard work culminated in a full scholarship to ULAB, awarded through a partnership between JAAGO Foundation and ULAB to support deserving students from underserved backgrounds. Each year, one student is selected for this prestigious scholarship, and Shurma was honored to be the recipient.

Shurma's journey highlights the power of education and community support.



Ruyada's story of overcoming adversity with hope and education

Ruyada has faced incredible challenges from an early age. Her father, born with limited mobility, drives an auto-rickshaw, and her mother, blind since birth, both work tirelessly to support their family. Despite their efforts, the financial strain made education seem impossible for their children.

However, everything changed when they discovered JAAGO Foundation's free education program. Enrolling Ruyada at JAAGO's Banani School marked a turning point for the family.

Since then, Ruyada has excelled in her studies, earning praise from her teachers and pride from her parents. What once seemed like an impossible dream—to see their daughter become a doctor—is now a real possibility.

Through JAAGO's Sponsor A Child program, Ruyada's education is supported, ensuring she continues her journey without financial barriers. Her story is not just one of education; it's a testament to resilience, hope, and the transformative power of opportunity.



Chaiti's story of breaking barriers and redefining possibilities

Chaiti grew up in a small village in Cumilla, Bangladesh. Her father is a farmer and the sole breadwinner of the family. Despite the family's limited income, her father was determined to provide his daughters with the education they deserved. In a community where many questioned the value of educating girls, her father remained resolute, saying, "If I had a son, I would raise him with the best education. I will do the same for my daughters. My daughters are my pride." These words inspired Nusrat and her sisters to dream big.

Nusrat excelled in her studies from a young age, achieving a Golden GPA-5 in her SSC exams. She wanted to pursue science, but the cost associated would have become a burden on her father, so she switched to the humanities stream. After completing her HSC exams, Nusrat started preparing for public university admission test. The journey was not easy, but she stayed resilient and through hard work and

determination, Nusrat enrolled in the Health Economics Department at Dhaka University.

The financial strain of moving to Dhaka was significant, but everything changed when Nusrat learned about the U-Go sponsored JAAGO Women Scholarship Program, designed to support meritorious female students. With her strong academic performance, Nusrat applied for and received the scholarship, easing her family's financial burden and allowing her to focus solely on her studies.

This scholarship was a turning point in Nusrat's life, providing her the opportunity to pursue her dreams without the weight of financial constraints. Her parents, particularly her father, were incredibly proud of her achievements. Nusrat's journey stands as a powerful reminder of how education, when supported by a community, can break barriers and change lives, giving hope for a brighter future.



Youth Empowerment Summit (YES)

The 2024 Youth Empowerment Summit (YES), organized by JAAGO Foundation, brought together over 400 youth from across Bangladesh for three days of learning, networking, and empowerment. This signature training program aimed to equip young leaders with the knowledge, skills, and opportunities needed to drive positive change in their communities.

The summit focused on enhancing youth leadership and civic engagement, with discussions, debates, and creative showcases to highlight the role of youth in community development and national policy. Participants also learned about skill development through digital learning platforms, gaining insights

into employment, entrepreneurship, and social impact.

An important part of the event focused on online safety, educating youth about responsible social media use and safe internet practices. The program reached thousands across the country, helping young people engage more responsibly in the digital world.

The summit also included cultural activities, sports sessions to promote teamwork, and a musical night to celebrate the event's success. The YES Summit exemplified the power of youth, providing them with the tools to become effective leaders and agents of positive change.



VBD in emergency response to save lives

As cyclone Rimal brought widespread devastation to the coastal areas of Satkhira, approximately 221,176 individuals were affected and 1,468 houses were completely destroyed. Residents from 43 unions across the district suffered due to the disaster.

Particularly in Shyamnagar and Ashashuni upazilas, tidal surges submerged fish enclosures, farmlands, and entire fishing villages. In response to the crisis, Volunteer for Bangladesh (VBD) stepped in with immediate relief efforts.

The volunteers immediately mobilized to carry out surveys, launching swift emergency

rescue operations in the most affected unions of Paddapukur and Gabura. They identified 400 families in critical need, quickly distributing essential supplies to help them survive the aftermath of the cyclone.

The relief packages contained rice, lentils, potatoes, soyabean oil, garlic, dry food like chira and muri, oral saline, paracetamol, and sanitary napkins for women. For people who had lost their all, this relief was like a lifeline. The community's overwhelming response and gratitude affirmed the importance of timely and compassionate intervention in times of crisis.



A layer deeper, the team leaders play a crucial role in operationalising the strategic vision and managing specific projects or departments with agility and innovation. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

JAAGO's organisational structure is designed to enable efficient operations and effective program delivery. Each department has clear roles and responsibilities, facilitating collaboration across functions to achieve shared goals.

Admin and Procurement

The Administration and Procurement Department ensures efficient operations and resource management. Administration handles logistics, office infrastructure, document control, and staff support, fostering inter-departmental coordination and compliance with policies. Procurement manages sourcing of goods and services, focusing on transparency, cost-effectiveness, and quality assurance. Key functions include vendor selection, contract negotiation, inventory management, and alignment with project budgets. The department collaborates with finance and other teams to ensure timely delivery of resources, supporting smooth project implementation and adherence to organisational standards, contributing to the overall mission's success.

Child Welfare Department

Child Welfare Department (CWD) manages relationships between sponsors and sponsored children, ensuring smooth communication and transparency. It oversees the well-being of sponsored children by tracking their progress, addressing needs, and providing updates to sponsors. Core functions include maintaining detailed records, facilitating correspondence, and resolving queries from sponsors and beneficiaries. The department ensures compliance with organisational policies on child protection and safeguarding. By fostering trust and engagement, it supports donor retention and

enhances the impact of sponsorship programs, contributing to the organisation's mission of improving children's lives through sustainable support systems.

Child Welfare Team

Child Welfare Team (CWT), a group of enthusiastic individuals united by one goal: ensuring our students' personal growth. The team conducts counselling sessions for the students and their parents, organises events highlighting the students' achievements, hosts community outreach programs, and provides additional support when required. Extending their efforts beyond the confinement of the school walls, CWT takes regular updates on students' overall well-being and takes action if any student is at risk of dropping out. Through their relentless effort and hard work, the team not only helps create a better future for our students but in essence, also contributes to shaping a better nation.

Digital and Creative

The Digital and Creative Department (DC) manages branding, communication, and digital campaigns. Its services include media planning, creative content development, and stakeholder communication. DC supports internal and external campaigns with strategic planning, design, and web development, ensuring consistent branding. It bridges communication needs across teams and handles external donor engagement through comprehensive media strategies.

Finance

The Finance Department handles budgeting, reporting, and compliance. It oversees cash management, payroll, and audits, ensuring financial control and transparency. Core activities include budget preparation, resource allocation, and reporting to stakeholders. It implements robust segregation of duties and internal controls to maintain fiscal discipline, supporting other departments with financial insights for planning and execution.

Founder's Office

The Founder's Office (FO) refers to the core team working directly with JAAGO's founder, Korvi Rakshand. This office oversees high-level strategic planning, stakeholder engagement, and organisational development. The department plays a crucial role in decision-making, donor relations, partnerships, and ensuring JAAGO's long-term sustainability.

Fundraising and Grants Management

Fundraising and Grants Management (FnG) identifies funding opportunities, manages grant proposals, and ensures compliance with donor guidelines. It collaborates with project and finance teams for budgeting and resource allocation. The department focuses on maintaining donor relations, ensuring transparency, and optimizing funding to achieve organisational goals.

Human Resources

The Human Resources (HR) Department supports employee management through recruitment, training, and compliance with organisational policies. It addresses staff concerns, ensures adherence to anti-harassment and child protection policies, and manages payroll and leave systems. Regular updates to HR policies promote an inclusive and safe work environment, emphasizing transparency and adherence to legal and organisational standards.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring and Evaluation (MEAL) ensures project efficiency through data-driven monitoring, evaluations, and accountability. It supports program improvement by collecting and

analyzing data, managing feedback systems, and conducting capacity-building sessions. MEAL collaborates across departments for effective project design, implementation, and reporting, fostering a culture of continuous learning. It assures donor confidence through transparent reporting and adheres to organisational and international standards.

Private Sector Engagement

Private Sector Engagement (PSE) secures funding and partnerships by aligning corporate sponsorships with organisational objectives. It develops project proposals, monitors expenditures, and maintains sponsor relations. PSE collaborates across departments to ensure efficient resource use and transparent reporting, aiming to enhance donor trust and long-term partnership.

Project Implementation Team

Project Implementation Team (PIT) executes donor-funded social development projects focusing on education, gender equality, and youth empowerment. Youth Development Program

Youth Development Program (YDP) at JAAGO Foundation empowers youth through dynamic volunteer management, impactful program implementation, and leadership development. By recruiting and training volunteers across 64 districts, YDP enables youth to lead initiatives addressing education, health, climate action, and gender equality. The department designs and executes community-driven projects, allocates resources efficiently, and organizes events like debates and workshops to foster civic engagement. Through skill-building sessions, YDP enhances employability, advocacy, and leadership among young participants. Additionally, the program collaborates with government bodies, NGOs, and community organisations to mobilize resources, advocate for youth-focused issues, and amplify the impact of campaigns via social media and community outreach.







Notes to the Financial Statements
For the year ended 30 June 2024

1.00 Background:

JAAGO Foundation was established to address the need for accessible quality education and social empowerment in Bangladesh to eradicate poverty, particularly for individuals from marginalised communities. The journey began in 2007 with the leadership of Korvi Rakshand, Founder, JAAGO, who recognised the deep-rooted issues of poverty and inequality plaguing our country. JAAGO works to substantially improve the lives of underprivileged children and youth living in poverty, illiteracy, and social inequality. This is done through quality education and youth empowerment.

JAAGO is registered under the registrar of joint stock companies and firms, Bangladesh.

Core programs of JAAGO Foundation: Digital School Program and Youth Development Program.

1.01 Digital School Program

JAAGO Foundation's Digital School Program (DSP) is an initiative that aims to address the lack of access to quality education due to geographical barriers in Bangladesh. Many villages in the country lack primary schools, leaving a significant number of children without access to complete education. Innovative solutions were needed to tackle the situation. A lack of motivation among students and a scarcity of skilled and qualified teachers were also crucial challenges. In response, the Digital School Program was introduced, which has become a model pedagogic teaching approach. The Digital School Program connects classrooms in rural and hard-to-reach areas to qualified teachers in Dhaka via video conferencing technology. The purpose of this initiative is to educate underserved and hard-to-reach children all across Bangladesh with ICT-based education. JAAGO Digital School Program provides free of cost education to underprivileged children (ages 4 to 16) following the English version of the NCTB (National Curriculum and Textbook Board) curriculum. JAAGO's Digital School Program has gained recognition from the government of Bangladesh, attracting a large number of children and their families. Leveraging digital technology, DSP made quality education accessible to all.

1.02 Youth Development Program

Youth consists of approximately one-third of the total population of Bangladesh which signifies the need to invest in the human capital of young people and focus on meeting their needs. Youth are the driving force behind social change and innovation and JAAGO has focused on empowering youth to become active and engaged citizens.

JAAGO Foundation stepped forward to provide the youth of Bangladesh with a voice and a platform through its Youth Development Program, and established its Youth Wing, Volunteer for Bangladesh (VBD), in 2011 to foster volunteerism and civic responsibility among the young population of Bangladesh.

This program focuses on national development by reallocating skills and resources to foster self-reliance and growth in every young citizen. Youth Development Program provides the opportunity to empower the youth, facilitate volunteerism, and foster self-resilience and growth while equipping them with the necessary tools to shape them for a meaningful future to Achieve the UN SDGs 2030.

Currently, more than 50,000 youth volunteers across the 64 districts of Bangladesh are actively involved in contributing to the integrated and sustainable development of the country.

Volunteer for Bangladesh engages young volunteers in activities such as awareness campaigns, tree planting, blood donation drives, emergency response and more and also helps them develop essential skills such as leadership, teamwork, and project management. This experience empowers young people to become proactive and responsible citizens. The Youth Development Program of JAAGO serves as a model for youth-led volunteerism and community service.

2.00 Objectives of the organisation

- To ensure the physical and emotional development of underserved children
- To work with socially disadvantaged people, particularly with an emphasis on underprivileged children and youth.
- To rebuild the nation through empowering the youth
- To contribute to the sustainable social development process in the country
- To engage youth with the communities to integrate volunteerism in achieving Sustainable Development Goals

3.00 Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention.

3.01 Depreciation on Property, Plant & Equipment

Depreciation on property, plant & equipment has been charged on Reducing Balance Method at rates varying from 5% to 33% depending on the classes and estimated useful life of the assets. Depreciation is not charged on assets acquired less than 6 months from year-end.

3.02 Accounting for Grants

International Accounting Standards (IAS) 20 "Accounting for Government Grants and disclosure of Government Assistance" is followed for recognition of grant income. As per BAS 20 grant received is initially recorded as liability. Grant amount used for project expenses has been recognized as income to the extent of expenses incurred.

3.03 Provision for Liabilities

Provision and accrued expenses are to be recognized in the financial statement when the project has a present obligation resulting from past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate of the amount can be made as per IAS-37 (Provisions, Contingent liabilities and Contingent Assets).

3.04 Expenses

Expenses has been recognized as incurred in accordance with accrual basis assumption of IAS 1: Presentation of Financial Statements.

The financial statements are presented in Bangladeshi currency BDT which has been rounded off to nearest Taka.

Comparative information has been disclosed in respect of the year for all numerical information in the financial statements and also the narrative information where it is relevant for understanding of the current year's financial statements. Figures for the comparative year have been re-arranged wherever considered necessary to ensure better comparability with the current year.

4.04 Cash & Cash Equivalents

Cash & cash equivalents include cash in hand and with banks on current and deposit accounts which are held and available for use by the project without any restriction.

Points of Light recognizes outstanding individual volunteers in 54 Commonwealth nations – people who make a difference in their communities.



UNESCO King Hamad Bin Isa Al-Khalifa Award 2016

JAAGO Foundation was acknowledged with the UNESCO King Hamad Bin Isa Al-Khalifa Award for the Use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) in Education in 2016. The award was handed over to Mr. Rakshand by Ms. Irina Bokova- Director General, UNESCO at the UNESCO headquarters in Paris. It was the first time that a Bangladeshi organization got recognized by UNESCO.
